

**Training Schedule** 





#### MODULE 1 – 12 hours The Foundation for Meeting the Developmental Needs of Children at Risk

The knowledge and skills developed during these four sessions are critical to successfully fulfilling any parenting role. Participants learn to assess and build self-esteem, understand behaviour, and develop effective interpersonal skills. These sessions help participants connect their understanding of self-esteem and the meaning of behaviour to the use of effective communication skills and the discipline process.

#### MODULE 2 – 9 hours Using Discipline to Protect, Nurture, and Meet Developmental Needs

This module builds on concepts and skills from Module 1 to increase participant understanding of the importance of discipline in meeting developmental needs. Participants learn concrete techniques and skills to use to manage behaviour effectively. The three sessions in this module focus on proactive and reactive approaches to using discipline to protect, nurture, and advance children's development.

Families who have completed Modules 1 and 2 may register for the following optional training modules:

#### MODULE 3 – 6 hours Addressing Developmental Issues Related to Sexuality

This two-session module focuses on techniques for educating children and youth about sexuality. The first session provides information on normal sexual development and behavior in children in youth and identifies factors that indicate problematic sexual behavior. The second session focuses on creating a safe and affirming home for LGBTQ+ youth with a focus on exploring personal beliefs and values.

#### MODULE 4 – 6 hours Responding to the Signs and Symptoms of Sexual Abuse

This module consists of two sessions. The first increases participant understanding of sexual abuse. The second focuses on assisting foster parents to respond effectively to the issues of sexual abuse. Participants must complete Module 3 before registering for Module 4.

#### MODULE 5 – 9 hours Supporting Relationships Between Children and Their Birth Families

This module helps foster parents to understand the importance of the child's family relationships and to develop skills to support these relationships. Participants learn ways to share the parenting role and to help birth parents.

#### MODULE 6 – 9 hours

Working as a Professional Team Member This module provides foster parents and staff with an understanding of how the professional team works on behalf of children and families. The three sessions include information and skill development related to teamwork, the tasks of foster parents as professional team members, and conflict management.

#### MODULE 7 – 6 hours Promoting Children's Personal and Cultural Identity

This module addresses the meaning of culture, the concept of cultural competence, and the impact of culture on self-esteem. Participants learn how to incorporate the child's culture and traditions into daily life, how to manage the diverse traditions within the family, and the importance of recording the child's life story in a way that promotes a positive sense of identity.

#### MODULE 9 – 9 hours Managing the Fostering Experience

This module examines the impact of placement on the foster family. Participants explore ways to manage the changes, transitions, and challenges they will face. They consider how they might manage the impact of abuse and neglect allegations, the importance of safeguarding, documentation, and the Protocol for Investigation of Allegations of Abuse in a Foster Home

#### MODULE 11 – 6 hours Understanding and Promoting Infant and Child Development

A growing body of knowledge in child development provides more hope than ever that children—even those who have experienced significant trauma—can be helped to achieve their developmental goals. Participants explore basic concepts in child development, research that supports these, and how these concepts shape our approach to providing care for these infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and school-aged children.

#### MODULE 12 - 6 hours

#### Understanding and Promoting Preteen and Teen Development

This module addresses key developmental tasks of pre-teens and teens, barriers and challenges to healthy development that youth in family foster care are likely to experience, and how this ultimately impacts the youth's ability to successfully transition to adulthood. Participants are guided to develop strategies to promote resilience and healthy development.

#### MODULE AS-1 – 9 hours Caring for Children Who Have Experienced Domestic Violence

This Advanced and Specialized training module provides a basis for understanding the dynamics of domestic violence, including why victims often remain with their abusers, the connection between domestic violence and child abuse, the impact of domestic violence on children. Participants learn strategies for parenting children who have experienced domestic violence. Prerequisites: P.R.I.D.E. Core Modules 1, 2, 11, and 12.

#### MODULE AS-2 – 6 hours Teens in Care: Supporting Attachment

This Advanced and Specialized training module helps participants understand how trauma and loss, experienced in early stages of development, will affect the teen's ability to form and build healthy relationships. Emphasis is placed on the practical aspects of integrating teens into the family routine and ways to promote healthy relationships with the teen on a day-to-day basis. A social worker referral is needed to register for this module. Prerequisites: P.R.I.D.E. Core Modules 1, 2, 11, and 12.

#### MODULE AS-3 – 9 hours Working Together to Improve the Educational Outcomes for Youth

This Advanced and Specialized training module helps participants to improve educational outcomes for youth in care. The module focuses primarily on the needs of youth aged 12 and older. Prerequisites: P.R.I.D.E. Core Modules 1, 2, 11, and 12.

#### MODULE AS-4 – 12 hours Preparing Youth for Successful Adulthood

Youth preparing to leave care need to develop life skills such as getting a job, managing money, and learning how to cook, but they also need strong and lasting relationships with caring adults. This Advanced and Specialized training focuses on the importance of stable, consistent, and healthy relationships in helping youth learn life skills and transition effectively into adulthood. Prerequisites: P.R.I.D.E. Core Modules 1, 2, 11, and 12.

#### FASD and the Developing Brain - 6 hours

This module considers the impact of alcohol exposure on fetal brain development and the resulting physical, cognitive, and behavioural impacts. The training offers evidence-based ways to support affected children in care, their birth families, and their resource families.

#### Understanding Trauma - 12 hours

Understanding how trauma impacts children and their families who have experienced abuse, neglect, and violence and other trauma is critical for resource families and professionals working with them. Those who have experienced trauma may not feel safe, even when they are no longer in danger. In this training participants learn how taking concrete steps to promote physical and psychological safety can help manage the challenging behaviours that these children and their families present.

#### Managing Transitions - 6 hours

Adjusting to change can be very challenging for the children entrusted to our care. This module examines the impact of transitions on children who have experienced trauma. Participants will gain an understanding of the types of transitions children in their care might experience, how the child's response is intertwined with their experiences of trauma, and the impact this has on the resource family. In addition, participants will learn specific strategies to support children's emotional safety as they manage the challenging responses and behaviors these children and families present with.

# All foster caregivers are eligible to attend training.

You must attend all listed dates to receive a certificate of attendance.
